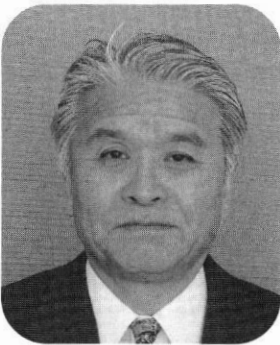
Please accept my sincere congratulations and best wishes for the 20th anniversary of Tokoname City Students' International Exchange Conference Association or TSIE.

Kristine's character is very cheerful and friendly. I hope I can be just liked her someday.



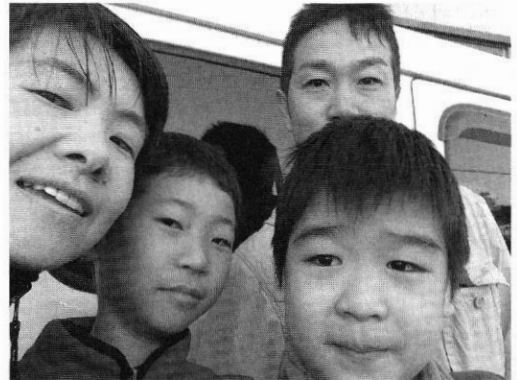
Hiraoka Takuto (Nishiuraminami ES)

I visited Bethany elementary school in America from August 8th to August 29th, 2013.

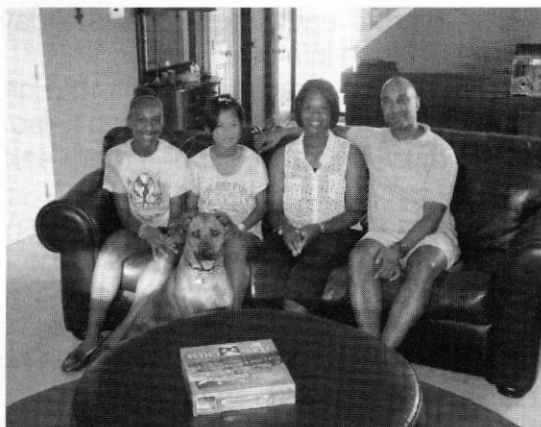
It has been 2 years since I visited there.

So as I did gestures and looked up in my dictionary, they could understand what I said. I was so happy.

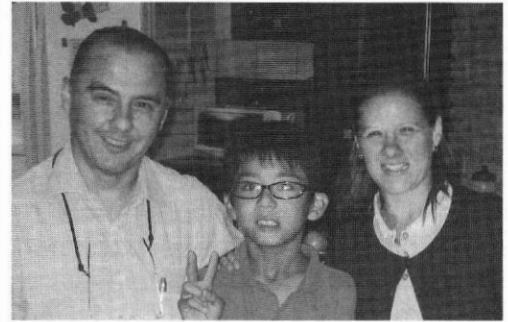
As I could have wonderful experience, I hope the exchange programs continue.

I hope that the activity continues for a long time, also I would like to express my heartfelt thanks for everyone.

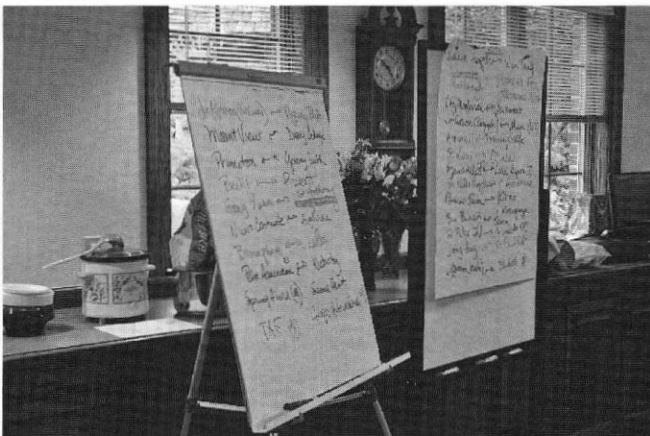
At the ISSE Conferences
